### The Campbell Movement

WALTER SCOTT

*(Continued where it was left off last week)*

While there were no “visible results,” it does not follow that the sermon was a failure. Perhaps the greatest effect was upon the preacher himself. He had “broken the ice.” He had done a thing concerning which he had doubts and fears. He had gained strength and courage thereby. Henceforth it would be easier. He had taken a position that must be maintained, and now that he had overcome the difficulties of the first step, he was encouraged to go on. Moreover, the effort had awakened in his own mind new trains of thoughts. He had a wider grasp, a better understanding of the subject, and he felt that in the future he could present it in a much fuller and more forcible manner. He determined to assume full responsibility for what he had preached and because he was certain it was the truth, and therefore his duty to proclaim it anywhere and everywhere, he decided to declare it in the very place where he had received his appointment. He accordingly announced that he would deliver in New Lisbon a series of sermons upon the “Ancient Gospel.”

When the time appointed for the first sermon arrived, there was a large crowd assembled. The manner in which the speaker introduced his theme, together with his obvious earnestness and excitement, created great interest and expectation upon the part of his hearers. He began with Peter’s confession in Matt. 16:16, “Thou art the Christ the Son of the living God,” and connected it with his answer to the question propounded on the day of Pentecost, “Men and brethren, what shall we do?” Since the Lordship and glory of Christ was his favorite theme, and on this occasion he was animated with more than his usual fervor, he waxed exceedingly eloquent and held his audience spellbound as he gradually developed the Christian creed—the rock upon which Christ declared he would build his church. He proved Christ to be divine, the Lord of glory, the King of kings by the prophets, by his supernatural wisdom, divine love, healing power, and victory over the grave, all of which were detailed by the writer of the New Testament that men might believe and “that believing, ye might have life through his name.” He went on to show just how the

gospel was administered in the beginning—how believers were baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, into the death of Christ and being buried with him in baptism were raised up to walk in newness of life. He explained how in this symbolic act they reached the blood of Christ and received the remission of sins and the gift of the
